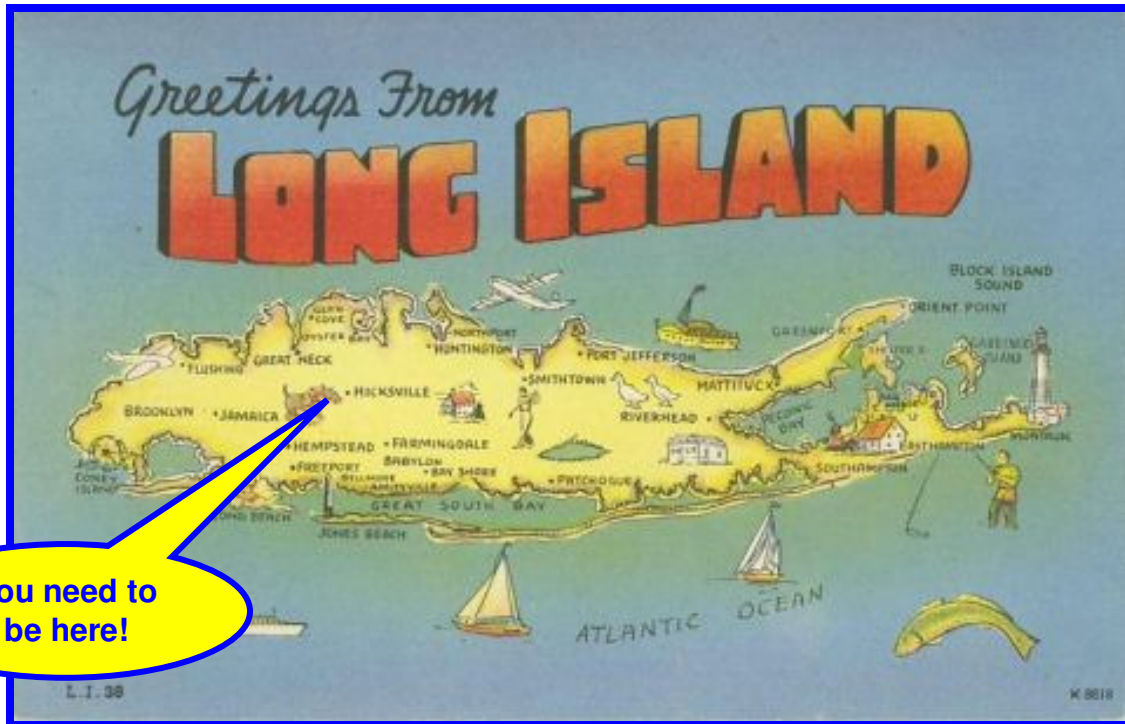
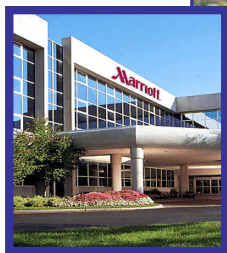

'Father (Grandfather) of the AS/400'

Frank Gerald Soltis, an American computer scientist, was IBM's Chief Scientist for the System independent machine interface (TIMI) and single-level store has appeared in these eight generations of IBM hardware: System/38 in 1978, the CISC AS/400 in 1988, the RISC AS/400 in 1995, the web server AS/400e in 1999 (supporting HTTP and TCP/IP), the eServer iSeries, the System i5, the System i, and Power Systems running i (April, 2008).

Frank Soltis retired from IBM on December 31, 2008.

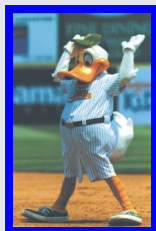
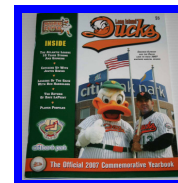
